Leveraging Lessons Learned at HighSight

Since 2020, **BMO Harris Bank** has hosted seven HighSight alumni for college internships in banking. Berenice Perez '19 had a successful experience there last summer, tapping her intelligence and networking skills. As a result, this July Berenice will be the first to take on a full-time position with BMO Harris, joining their 2023 Commercial Analyst Development Program, an introduction to commercial banking for recent graduates.

Berenice credits HighSight for helping her achieve this opportunity. "HighSight taught me the critical skill of developing a strategic plan to get the things I want. All these gave me a head start – setting priorities, time management, networking, study skills," she reflected. "I wouldn't be graduating from St. Olaf College or heading to BMO without HighSight. I did the heavy lifting, but HighSight gave me the tools and opened the door."

When Bob started tutoring in 2015, he quickly saw HighSight was a place he could belong. **"I found HighSight to be a true community, where scholars, families, staff, and volunteers work closely,"** Bob remembers.

A retired historian from the National Park Service, Bob has helped dozens of HighSight scholars with history, geography, and government, while also helping them with their writing.

"HighSight is committed to building both life and academic skills," Bob added. "The experience of watching scholars mature during four years of high school has been tremendously rewarding for me. Of all my volunteer gigs, HighSight has been the most satisfying."

During the height of the pandemic, a co-worker at PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) invited Rob to join an online tutoring session for HighSight scholars. He thought that Rob, a graduate school instructor for six years when working on his

doctorate in economics at the University of Minnesota after he graduated from Harvard, would enjoy tutoring at HighSight. He was right.

"I love every second of it," Rob shared. "The scholars appreciate the help...and the results speak for themselves, with HighSight's success helping them get into great colleges."

"While some are really gifted, it is most rewarding to work with scholars who aren't 'naturals' but who really want to do well," Rob reflected. **"Without help, they would likely be C or D students, but the tutoring makes things click for them – and suddenly they're getting Bs and higher. That makes it worth it for me."**

Leslie Garfias '18

De La Salle Institute | St. Olaf College



After graduating from St. Olaf College last year, Leslie returned to tutor scholars, feeling that she "just had to" return to help at HighSight.

"I've been given so much," Garfias shared, "and I

needed to come back to the place where it was given to me. The things I learned at HighSight prepared me more than other students at college, and I want to give the same leg up to the current scholars."

Leslie will begin dental school at the University of Minnesota this fall – and HighSight helped shape that journey, too. Before her senior year in high school, Leslie traveled to Jordan as part of an international program HighSight helped arrange for her, where she learned about the culture and history of the Middle East and took part in public health projects.

Leslie saw how the basic care dentists provided refugees who hadn't had dental care in years relieved so much pain and distress. She then knew she wanted to be a dentist. **"HighSight helped me fall in love with science and with art. I now saw I could combine those through dentistry."**

When Brianna moved to Chicago last summer to work in real estate client services after graduating from Indiana University, she found HighSight – and has been a faithful tutor every week since.

Mathematics was her favorite subject in school, so Brianna was happy when a HighSight scholar reported acing a recent exam using a visualization technique Brianna had shared. "I'm glad that I remembered more algebra than I thought and that the approach actually worked," she reflected.

Brianna is happy she found HighSight. **"The support that HighSight provides is important and insightful. It helps the scholars with better access to resources and quality education – something that, sadly, isn't a given for all students."**



Being a stranger in a strange land – and only one of two Americans in her summer cohort – made Layla more open to the tales she heard from her host family and other villagers. This helped clarify her life mission: to share people's stories.

As a first year student at DePauw University in Greencastle, Indiana, Layla joined the student newspaper, starting as a features writer and arts and culture reporter. Layla excelled and now serves as editor-in-chief. **"The skills I learned in prioritizing and time management at HighSight have been a major benefit, as a student and especially as a journalist,"** Layla shared.

Last year, Layla received a Carnegie-Knight News21 internship at the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism at Arizona State University which brings together top journalism students. Layla is leveraging these experiences to take on graduate studies in journalism this fall. "I've been accepted at Northwestern and Syracuse, and I'm still waiting to hear from Columbia and others.
